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Burmese ruby ban closes loophole, but opens door to bureaucratic maze

WASHINGTON—A long-expected U.S. ban on gemstones from Myanmar has been signed into law, ending the suspense about when it would happen but raising questions about what happens next.

For a short time period, it remains legal to import Burmese rubies into the United States from Myanmar. But as of Sept. 27, which is 60 days from the date that President Bush signed the "Tom Lantos Block Burmese JADE Act of 2008," all bets are off.
